The "I AM" Radio Network, owned by VFCM, has broadcast the gospel to Alaska for 33 years, beginning with KIAM in Nenana back in 1985, then adding KYKD Bethel in 1996, and KAGV Houston/Big Lake in 2006. The network feeds 21 village stations located all across the state, from Prudhoe Bay/Deadhorse in the north to Sand Point in the south. This allows our dedicated team of volunteers and missionaries to broadcast the gospel to native and rural Alaskans all across this vast, rugged state. We can cost-

effectively send gospel preaching and teaching 24/7 to places where it's very difficult to send or maintain gospel preachers. Radio allows a consistent way to preach salvation, disciple believers, heal the broken-hearted, encourage the dispirited, and bring hope to the hopeless in very inaccessible areas. Since arriving in Houston, AK in the spring of 2015, a lot has happened. For me personally, I got married and I also took on the role of managing the radio station KAGV 1110 AM "Alaska's Gospel Voice." I love this station! Two years ago it was run remotely by volunteers serving in Nenana, with two local volunteers in the studio about once a week. Since that time I have trained 5 new volunteers (one of them is my husband - he has a great radio voice!) particularly for the role of announcing daily local weather forecasts and recording Scripture readings for weekly broadcast.



YUP'IK AUDIO BIBLE

One of the most unique projects in Alaska is currently underway within Voice for Christ family - the Yup'ik Audio Bible. Palmer Bailey is not only the station manager for KYKD, but also the financial go-to guy for the entire ministry and a willing technical resource for us all.

Palmer and his wife, Bonnie, felt led of God to have the entire Bible

recorded in the Yup'ik language, which is spoken by many in western Alaska. Currently, local Yup'ik speakers in Bethel committed to this endeavor have recorded nearly 44% of the scriptures, which the Baileys have edited into the final format.

Donors have given funds specifically to purchase solar-powered radios to give away to those within range of KYKD or KYKD-fed village translators. The newer model radios have enough on-board memory to hold both the Yup'ik and English versions of the Bible. Many listeners have gratefully accepted a device from our volunteers in order to hear gospel music and teaching as they work in their homes or fish camps.

Please pray for strength and endurance as the Baileys seek to meet the added time demands of recording sessions. God is faithful!
